My goal in joining the Citizens Advisory Committee is to continue to be engaged with my community and to help improve transit along a major thoroughfare in our City. I was on the Board of Directors at the Richmond District Neighborhood Center for almost five years and enjoyed the access that it provided me to all of the different families and groups living and working in the Richmond. 





I have had the privilege of serving on the Geary Bus Rapid Transit Citizen Advisory Committee for the past two years as a representative of the Tenderloin neighborhood. In that time, I have become steeped in the details of the project, from the design alternatives to the financing to the implementation timeline, and have been an active participant in the Committee's meetings and recommendations process. One particular focus of mine while serving on the Committee has been ensuring that adequate outreach has been done in the Tenderloin community around the project, as well as being an advocate for pedestrian improvements within the Inner Geary portion of the project, where some of the highest pedestrian injury intersections are located.
