

RESOLUTION ALLOCATING \$1,468,550 IN PROP K FUNDS, WITH CONDITIONS, AND \$392,450 IN PROP AA FUNDS, WITH CONDITIONS, FOR FOUR REQUESTS, SUBJECT TO THE ATTACHED FISCAL YEAR CASH FLOW DISTRIBUTION SCHEDULES AND AMENDING THE PROP AA STRATEGIC PLAN AND RELEVANT PROP K 5-YEAR PRIORITIZATION PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, The Transportation Authority received four requests, including Prop K allocation requests totaling \$1,468,550 for four projects and Prop AA allocation requests totaling \$392,450 for two projects, as summarized in Attachments 1 and 2 and detailed in the enclosed allocation request forms; and

WHEREAS, The requests seek funds from the following Prop K Expenditure Plan categories: New Signals and Signs, Signals and Signs Maintenance and Renovation, Pedestrian Circulation/Safety, and Curb Ramps; and from the Pedestrian Safety category of the Prop AA Expenditure Plan; and

WHEREAS, As required by the voter-approved Expenditure Plans, the Transportation Authority Board has adopted a Prop K or Prop AA 5-Year Prioritization Program (5YPP) for all of the aforementioned Expenditure Plan programmatic categories; and

WHEREAS, Two of the four requests are consistent with the relevant strategic plans and 5YPPs for their respective categories; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency's (SFMTA's) request for the Eddy and Ellis Traffic Calming Improvement project requires a concurrent financially-neutral Prop AA Strategic Plan amendment and a corresponding amendment to the Pedestrian Safety 5YPP, as detailed in the enclosed allocation request form; and



WHEREAS, The SFMTA's requests for the Masonic Avenue Signal Upgrade and Eddy and Ellis Traffic Calming Improvement projects require concurrent Prop K 5YPP amendments, as detailed in the enclosed allocation request forms; and

WHEREAS, After reviewing the requests, Transportation Authority staff recommended allocating a total of \$1,468,550 in Prop K funds, with conditions, and \$392,450 in Prop AA funds, with conditions, for four projects, as described in Attachment 3 and detailed in the enclosed allocation request forms, which include staff recommendations for Prop K and Prop AA allocation amounts, required deliverables, timely use of funds requirements, special conditions, and Fiscal Year Cash Flow Distribution Schedules; and

WHEREAS, There are sufficient funds in the Capital Expenditures line item of the Transportation Authority's approved Fiscal Year 2013/14 budget to cover the proposed actions; and

WHEREAS, At its January 22, 2014 meeting, the Citizens Advisory Committee was briefed on the subject request and unanimously adopted a motion of support for the staff recommendation; and

WHEREAS, On February 11, 2014, the Plans and Programs Committee reviewed the subject request and unanimously recommended approval of the staff recommendation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority hereby amends the Prop AA Strategic Plan to advance \$337,450 from Fiscal Year 2014/15 to Fiscal Year 2013/14 for the Eddy and Ellis Traffic Calming Improvement as detailed in the enclosed allocation request form; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority hereby amends the 5YPPs for the Prop K New Signals, Prop K Signals and Signs Maintenance and Renovation, and the Prop AA Pedestrian Safety categories of the relevant Expenditure Plans as detailed in the enclosed allocation request



forms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority hereby allocates \$1,468,550 in Prop K funds, with conditions, and \$392,450 in Prop AA funds, with conditions, for four requests, subject to the attached fiscal year cash flow distribution schedules, as summarized in Attachment 3 and detailed in the enclosed allocation request forms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority finds the allocation of these funds to be in conformance with the priorities, policies, funding levels, and prioritization methodologies established in the Prop K and Prop AA Expenditure Plans, the 2013 Prop K Strategic Plan Baseline, the 2012 Prop AA Strategic Plan, and the relevant 5YPPs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Transportation Authority hereby authorizes the actual expenditure (cash reimbursement) of funds for these activities to take place subject to the Fiscal Year Cash Flow Distribution Schedules detailed in the enclosed allocation request forms; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Capital Expenditures line item for subsequent fiscal year annual budgets shall reflect the maximum reimbursement schedule amounts adopted and the Transportation Authority does not guarantee reimbursement levels higher than those adopted; and be it further

RESOLVED, That as a condition of this authorization for expenditure, the Executive Director shall impose such terms and conditions as are necessary for the project sponsors to comply with applicable law and adopted Transportation Authority policies and execute Standard Grant Agreements to that effect; and be it further

RESOLVED, That as a condition of this authorization for expenditure, the project sponsors shall provide the Transportation Authority with any other information it may request regarding the use of the funds hereby authorized; and be it further



RESOLVED, That the Capital Improvement Program of the Congestion Management

Program, the Prop K Strategic Plan and the relevant 5YPPs are hereby amended, as appropriate.

<sup>1</sup>"EP Line No./Category" is either the Prop K Expenditure Plan line number referenced in the 2009 Prop K Strategic Plan or the Prop AA Expenditure Plan category referenced in the 2012 Prop AA Strategic Plan, including: Street Repair and Reconstruction (Street), Pedestrian Safety (Ped), and Transit Reliability and Mobility Improvements (Transit).

<sup>2</sup> Acronyms include SFMTA (San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency) and DPW (San Francisco Department of Public Works).

<sup>3</sup> "Project Type" differentiates between one-time capital projects (Capital) and on-going annual programs (Annual) funded by Prop K. Prop AA does not fund on-going annual programs.

<sup>4</sup> "Expected Leveraging By EP Line" is calculated by dividing the total non-Prop K funds expected to be available for a given Prop K Expenditure Plan line item (e.g. Pedestrian Circulation and Safety) by the total expected funding for that Prop K Expenditure Plan line item over the 30-year Expenditure Plan period. For example, expected leveraging of 90% indicates that on average non-Prop K funds should cover 90% of the total project cost and Prop K should cover only 10% of the project cost.

<sup>5</sup> "Actual Leveraging by Project Phase" is calculated by dividing the total non-Prop K funds in the project's funding plan by the total cost for the requested phase or phases. If the percentage in the "Actual Leveraging" column is lower than in the "Expected Leveraging" column, the particular request (indicated by yellow highlighting) is leveraging fewer non-Prop K dollars than assumed in the Expenditure Plan.

Prop AA funds will be used to design a new traffic signal at 8th and Natoma Streets. The project scope for the new traffic signals includes new pedestrian countdown indicators, signal controllers, underground conduit, wiring, poles and mast-arm mounted signal heads. The scope also includes 20 new or re-constructed curb ramps. The SFMTA expects to complete design by March 2015, begin construction by September 2015, and complete the project by September 2016.
33	SFMTA	Masonic Avenue Signal Upgrade	\$ 259,000	\$ -	Prop K funds will be used for construction of traffic signal upgrades at five intersections along Masonic Avenue at Turk, Fulton, Grove and Hayes Streets, and Golden Gate Avenue. The planned improvements include larger signal heads and new mast-arms, pole locations, pedestrian countdown signals, controllers, underground conduit, and transit signal priority hardware. The project scope also includes construction of 24 curb ramps at four intersections. Prop K funds will leverage \$739,000 in federal Highway Safety Improvement Program funds. The SFMTA expects to begin the signal project construction in May 2014, and have all improvements open for use by May 2015. This project is being coordinated with the Masonic Avenue Streetscape project, funded by the OneBayArea Grant program. Streetscape construction is anticipated to begin in March 2015 and be completed by October 2016. The SFMTA has also coordinated the project with improvements at Masonic/Anza and Masonic/Ewing (funding for the latter supplemented by Target Corp.) which are being implemented through Signal Modification Contract 33 (underway).
