




- ► Prop K request: \$110,000 Total project cost: \$335,000
- Upgrade an existing pedestrian ramp to be ADA compliant
- Provides access to Muni 14R
 Mission Rapid and 28 19th
 Avenue stops
- Improves Muni operations by eliminating need to stop twice
- Construction begins Spring 2018, done by Summer 2018

DTX Project Overview





Background



- The DTX environmentally-cleared alignment has three tracks from Fourth street to the Transbay Transit Center
- Over time, various entities have performed various levels of operational analyses
- While some analyses conclude that three tracks are needed, others conclude that only two are needed
- In view of these differences, the Transportation Authority Chair directed staff to perform an independent Peer Review of the studies

Purpose of Request



Funding for Transportation Authority-led Peer Review

- Three rail operations studies
- Inform key policymaker decisions Two versus three tracks
- \$180,000 Prop K request
