Late Night Phase II Overview



- Goal to improve late night and early morning transportation
- ► Led by Late Night Transportation Working Group
 - ► Staffing from TA, OEWD, Entertainment Commission
- ► Implementing next steps identified in Phase 1 study:
 - ► Begin a process to refresh all-night bus service network
 - Pilot program for location-specific improvements
 - ► Coordinated information campaign to better communicate existing services
 - All-night transportation monitoring practice








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Service Planning



- ► Analyzed late-night transit serving SF to identify potential service improvements
- **▶** Recommendations include:
 - ► Split Route 91, extend to Daly City
 - New service to Fisherman's Wharf
 - ► More frequent buses on Geary
 - ► Improved service to East Bay and Peninsula
- ► Next steps:
 - ► SFMTA, SamTrans working on planning/ funding/pilots to implement concepts
 - ► AC Transit service likely to decrease with BART-funded pilot ending; needs new funding to implement recommendations



Location-specific improvements

- ► Surveyed employers & workers in Lower Polk CBD and Union Square BID on area late-night needs
- ► Identified needs include:
 - **▶** Safety and security improvements
 - ► Pedestrian-scale lighting
 - Access to real-time transit info
- ► Next Steps:
 - ► Efforts to improve streetlights and transit stop amenities underway citywide
 - Agencies should incorporate late-night needs in corridor upgrades on the AllNighter network





Information campaign



- Worked with operators, MTC on marketing campaign to improve awareness of AllNighter service
 - ► New allnighter.511.org info portal
 - Regional AllNighter system map
 - New logo and marketing materials
 - **▶** Launched multichannel campaign
- ► Dramatically increased traffic to web portal during campaign
- ► Next Steps:
 - Transit agencies, MTC should continue using materials in future campaigns






Data Monitoring



- Developed set of metrics to track performance of nighttime transit – focus on:
 - Ridership
 - ► Productivity (e.g. riders/service hour)
 - ► Reliability
- ► Next Steps:
 - ► TA to conduct biennial monitoring on ongoing basis with support from transit operators




Other initiatives



► Shared taxis


- ► Coordinated with SFMTA to develop potential e-hail app criteria and car sharing regs
- Proposed regs not yet adopted by Taxi Task Force
- ► Rail service late-night hours
 - ► BART, Caltrain released white papers on maintenance constraints limiting late-night hours
 - ► SFMTA nearing completion of paper on constraints to light rail hours



Next Steps



- ► TA to coordinate with partners to implement recommendations:
 - Data monitoring
 - Help identify funding for service improvements
- ▶ Recommendation: MTC should lead future Late Night coordination
 - Would fulfill regional scope of coordination need
 - MTC developing potential new working group to address late night and other transit coordination
