Lifeline Transportation Program (LTP) Cycle 5 Overview



- Improve mobility for low income residents
 - **▶** Focus on Communities of Concern
 - Projects come from community-based planning process
- Congestion Management Agencies select county projects on behalf of Metropolitan Transportation Commission
- **▶** \$2,578,270 for San Francisco
- Only transit agencies eligible to apply
- ► 20% local match requirement



LTP Cycle 5 Call for Projects Eligible Project Types



- ► New, enhanced, or restored transit service, including late-night and weekend services
- Transit stop enhancements
- Purchase of vehicles or technologies
- Mobility management
- **▶** Shuttle service
- ► Taxi voucher programs





LTP Cycle 5 Call for Projects Evaluation



- MTC prioritization criteria
 - **▶** Serve Communities of Concern
 - ► Originate from plan with robust outreach to low income persons
 - ► Project readiness, budget, cost effectiveness, and performance indicators
- ► San Francisco-specific prioritization criteria
 - **▶** Provides transit service
 - ► Included in San Francisco's Late Night Transportation Study or Muni Service Equity Strategy
 - Geographic and project type diversity

Late Night Transit Service to Communities in Need (SFMTA)




- Two years of late night Muni service
 - New late-night service extending the L-Owl service to Fisherman's Wharf
 - ► Continue Owl service on 48 Quintara/24th Street and 44 O'Shaughnessy



- ► Total project cost: \$3,775,560
- SFMTA's highest priority project
- Recommendation: fully fund with \$2,578,270 in LTP Cycle 5 funds

LTP Cycle 5 Call for Projects Project Recommendations





Enhanced Shop-a-Round Service and Van Gogh Recreational Shuttle Service (SFMTA)



- ► Three years of continued SFMTA shuttle service:
 - ► Shop-a-Round Shuttle access to grocery stores
 - ► Van Gogh Shuttle access to social and recreational events
- Currently funded by LTP Cycle 2 funds
- ► Total project cost: \$562,500
- ► Recommendation: fully fund with \$450,000 in Prop K



Wheelchair Accessible Taxi Incentive Program



- Three-year pilot program
- Increase availability of wheelchair accessible taxis
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- ► Up to \$600/month incentive
- ► Require a minimum of 20 paratransit trips per month
- ► Total project cost: \$375,000
- Recommendation: fully fund with
 - ► \$200,000 in Prop K
 - **▶** \$100,000 in Cycle 2 LTP funds
