PLAN BAY AREA 2040 > SUMMARY

- Adoption date: 2017
- Update, not a new plan
- Keep same horizon year of 2040
- Focus on a few new areas only:
 - Goods movement
 - Adaptation
 - Economic prosperity
 - Affordability and Displacement
- Plan Bay Area 2040 is a plan not a programming commitment



What Does Plan Bay Area 2040 Include?



CONNECTING OUR COMMUNITY

- Jobs and housing allocation by jurisdiction by income level
- Revenue forecast
- Policies for future investment
- New grant programs (e.g. OBAG, transit core capacity challenge grants)

Financially constrained project list

- Project must be in Plan Bay Area 2040 to receive federal, state, regional funding
- Total project cost may not exceed what is shown in the Plan Bay Area

San Francisco Goals and Objectives Financial

PLAN BAY AREA 2040 > GOALS AND OBJECTIVES



- **1.** Ensure all San Francisco projects and programs that need to be in Plan Bay Area 2040 are included
- **2.** Advocate strongly for more investment in transit core capacity and transit state of good repair
- **3.** Increase share of existing revenues going toward San Francisco priorities
- 4. Advocate for new federal/state/regional revenues through Plan Bay Area 2040

Developing the Region's Financially Constrained Project List

PLAN BAY AREA 2040 > CALL FOR PROJECTS



- 3 calls for projects create PBA universe of projects:
 - Regionally significant projects / Regional transit operators
 - State of Good Repair: transit, local streets and roads
 - County CMA calls for projects (subject of today's item)
- MTC will conduct a performance evaluation on capacity changing projects greater than \$100M that are not already in construction
- MTC will identify a preferred scenario of financially constrained projects and programs

San Francisco's Plan Bay Area 2040 Call for Projects



- SFCTA issued a call for projects
 - Initial local discretionary funding budget: \$8.4 billion
 - Final financially constrained discretionary target will be lower
- What projects need to be identified?
 - Any project seeking federal, state, or regional funding before 2021
 - Any project seeking a federal action before 2021
 - Large and/or capacity changing projects
- Most projects bundled into programmatic categories

- Existing Plan Bay Area projects
 - Completed or canceled?
 - Revised scope, schedule, budget
 - What is local/regional discretionary funding need?

New projects

- Does it need to be individually listed or is it programmatic?
- Is it ready to proceed with construction before 2021?
- ► Is it included in the San Francisco Transportation Plan (SFTP)?
- ► If not in the SFTP :

Is it consistent with SFTP goals? What other plan status does it have?

SFMTA Rail Capacity Strategy

PLAN BAY AREA 2040 > LONG RANGE PLANNING



- Identification and some prioritization of near, medium, and long term rail investments (to be released fall 2015)
- Near Term Operational Improvements/SOGR
- Major Rail Investments
 - T-Third Phase III
 - Geneva Light Rail
 - Geary Light Rail
 - Upper Market/SOMA Light Rail to Mission Bay
 - Under-grounding existing rail lines

MTC Core Capacity Transit Study

PLAN BAY AREA 2040 > LONG RANGE PLANNING



Identification and prioritization projects to support travel to/from core SF job centers

Focus on transbay and Muni Metro markets

- Preliminary concepts by end of 2015
 - Drawing from numerous existing studies and concepts generated by public
 - Long term (e.g., new Transbay Tube, Muni East West connection)
 - Medium term (e.g., BART platform capacity, extension of Forest Hill Station to allow 4-car capacity, infill stations)
 - Near term (e.g., SOGR, Positive Train Control, new rolling stock)

SF Planning Railyard Alternatives and I-280 Boulevard Program



Scope of work:

- Look at potential for I-280 Removal from Mariposa or 16th
- Examine alignments for Caltrain Downtown Extension
- Loop track on east side of Transbay Terminal
- Reconfigure or relocate maintenance/storage functions at 4th/King Railyard
- New public realm improvements, housing and job opportunities
- Technical Feasibility Assessment to be completed in early 2016
- Concepts development/evaluation to be completed by September 2016

Coordinated San Francisco Long-Range Planning Effort

- Deliverables will include:
 - Minor focused update to SFTP (2016) to inform Plan Bay Area 2040

- September Information item at CAC and Plans and Programs Committee


