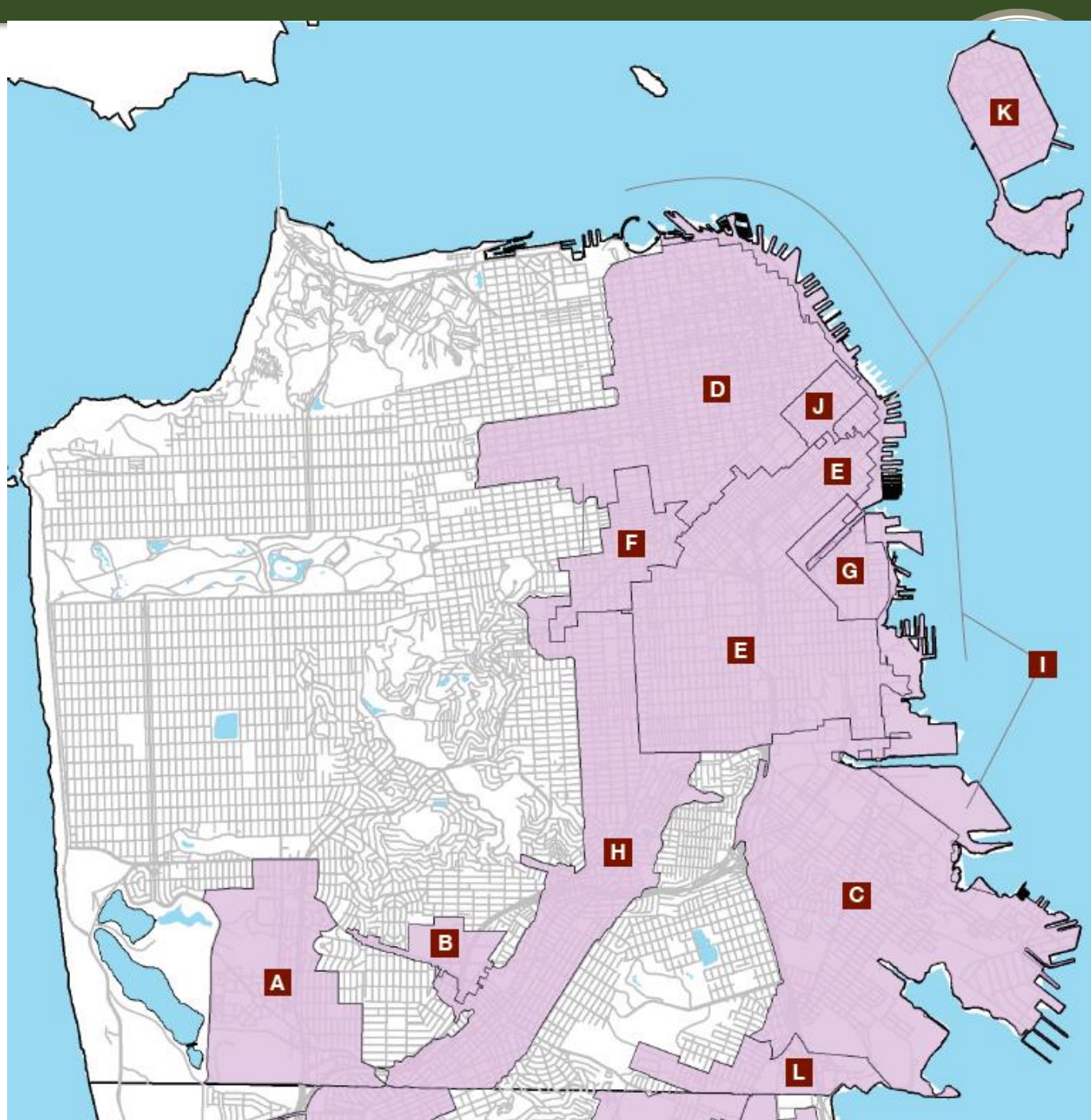
One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) Program – Cycle 2



- ▶ **Region's federal funding framework to support CA climate law and Plan Bay Area**
 - ▶ **Rewards jurisdictions that provide housing**
 - ▶ **Targets investments in the region's Priority Development Areas (PDAs)**
- ▶ **Provides ~45% of overall funding for County Program**
 - ▶ **Gives flexibility to support local priorities**
 - ▶ **Conditions eligibility on local jurisdictions alignment of general plan housing and complete streets policies**
 - ▶ **Congestion Management Agencies select county projects**

CMA Planning Augmentation	\$1.900
Safe Routes to School (SRTS)	\$1.797
Countywide OBAG2	\$40.489
TOTAL	\$44.186

Five-year program: Fiscal Years (FYs) 2017/18 – 2021/22

What Kind of Projects Can Be Funded?



- ▶ **Transit expansion, reliability and access improvements**
- ▶ **Smart system management**
- ▶ **Transportation demand management**
- ▶ **Safety and streetscape improvements**
- ▶ **Street resurfacing**
- ▶ **Safe Routes to School**
- ▶ **PDA planning and implementation**



How Will Projects be Selected?



- ▶ **Most screening and prioritization criteria dictated by MTC's extensive guidelines**
- ▶ **Some additions of San Francisco-specific criteria**

- ▶ **Screening criteria, e.g.**
 - ▶ **Scope is eligible and consistent with intent of OBAG**
 - ▶ **Consistent with Plan Bay Area**
 - ▶ **Added for SF: Consistent with San Francisco Transportation Plan**
 - ▶ **Eligible public agency applicant**
 - ▶ **Can meet strict federal timely use of funds requirements**
 - ▶ **Realistic funding plan through the life of the project, including required local match**

How Will Projects be Selected?



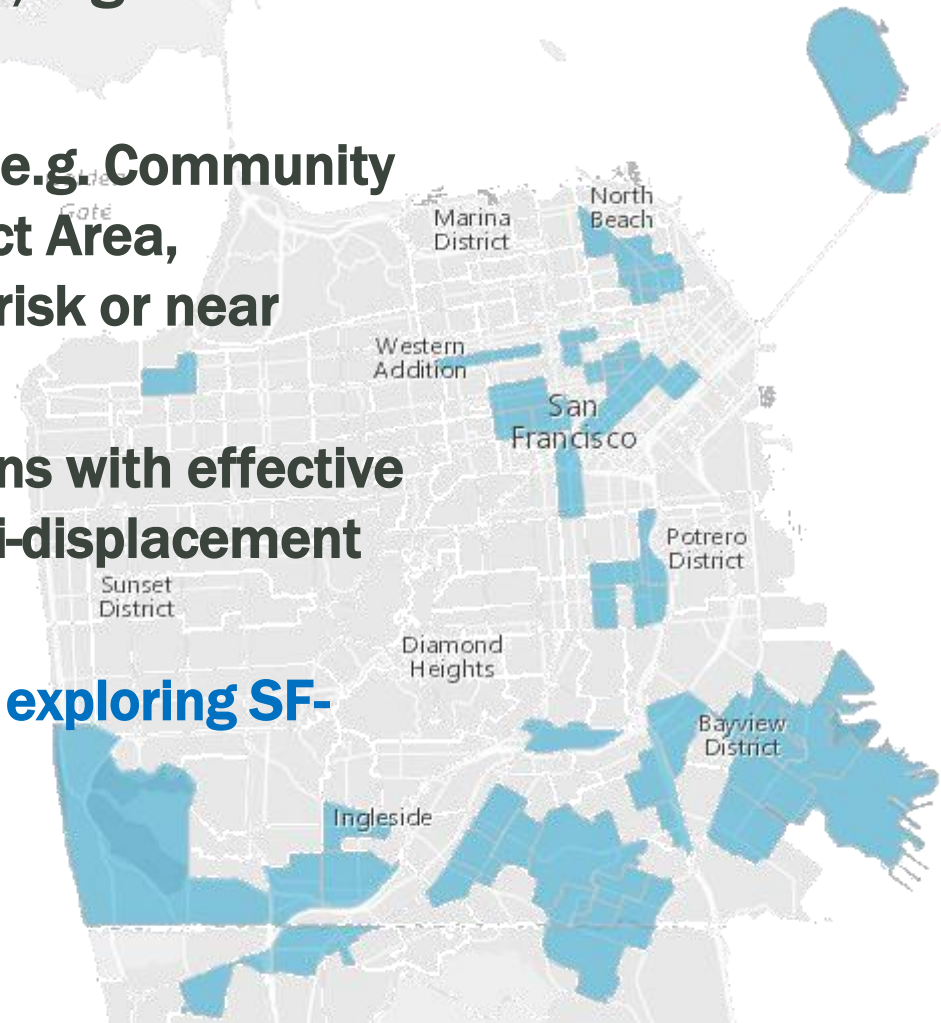
- ▶ **MTC's location-specific criteria, e.g.:**

- ▶ Located in or serving PDAs

- ▶ Other location considerations, e.g. **Community of Concern, High Impact Project Area, Community with identified air risk or near freight infrastructure**

- ▶ **Prioritize projects in jurisdictions with effective affordable housing and/or anti-displacement policies**

- **SF already compliant but exploring SF-appropriate criteria**



How Will Projects be Selected?

- ▶ **Most project-specific evaluation criteria are SF-specific, e.g.**
 - ▶ Project readiness (MTC criteria)
 - ▶ **Community support**
 - ▶ **Safety and multi-modal benefits**
 - ▶ **Coordination with multiple projects**
 - ▶ **Identified strategy to improve core capacity transportation**
 - ▶ **Limited alternate fund sources**

- ▶ **Other SF program-wide considerations:**
 - ▶ **Geographic equity**
 - ▶ **Project sponsors' priorities**

Applications due to Transportation Authority	April 21
Project recommendations approved by Board	June 27
County OBAG 2 recommendations due to MTC	July 31
MTC Commission approval	Fall
