#### NTIP A SFTP Recommendation



- Response to SFTP mobility and equity analysis findings
  - Walking, biking, and transit reliability initiatives are important ways to address socio-economic and geographic disparities
- Public and Board input: focus on neighborhoods
  - ► Focus on Communities of Concern and other underserved neighborhoods
- Project delivery analysis
  - Strengthen project delivery pipelines





## NTIP Funding for Planning and Implementation TRANSPORTATION PLAN 2040

#### Capital funds

- Prop K funds leveraging other funds to ideally deliver
   2 neighborhood scale (small- to mid-sized) projects
   in 5 years in each supervisorial district
- Planning funds
  - ► \$100K in Prop K funds for planning efforts in each supervisorial district
- Funds to be approved in SFTP Early Action Program/Prop K 5-Year Programs





## NTIP Planning What do we want to achieve?



- Build community awareness of/capacity to provide input into the transportation planning process
- Pipeline of neighborhood-scale capital projects for future funding with Prop K and/or other sources









## NTIP Planning Goals



NTIP Planning efforts should address one or more of these goals:

- Improve pedestrian and/or bicycle safety
- Encourage walking and/or biking
- Improve transit accessibility
- Improve mobility for Communities of Concern or other underserved neighborhoods and at-risk populations (e.g., seniors, children, and/or people with disabilities).

## NTIP Planning Efforts tailored to meet district needs



- District-wide needs and prioritization processes
  - Sunset Blueprint (District 4)
- Traditional neighborhood transportation plan
  - Tenderloin-Little Saigon Neighborhood Transportation Plan
  - Mission District Streetscape Plan
- Corridor plans
  - Leland Avenue Street Design plan
  - Columbus Avenue Neighborhood Transportation Study
- Project-level plans
  - Bayview Shuttle
  - Mini-grants (DPH ped safety planning grants match)







## NTIP Planning Planning Project Checklist



- Does your planning project have...?
  - Clear purpose and goals
  - **✓** Well-defined scope, schedule, budget
  - Clear and diverse community support
  - Coordination with other relevant planning efforts
  - Implementation model (agency/community roles)
  - Robust community engagement strategy
  - Community of Concern focus
  - ☑ Appropriate funding/leveraging







#### NTIP Planning Multiple Implementation Models



- Either a public agency or a community-based organization can lead a NTIP planning effort
  - ► SFCTA or consultant can provide technical assistance
- Grant recipient must be a Prop K-eligible sponsor
  - BART, DPW, PJCPB, Planning, SFMTA, SFCTA

- Spring 2014 Funds to be approved in SFTP
   Early Action Program/ Prop K 5-Year Programs
